"O mur aapunar dekh" is the state anthem or state song of Assam, India. It was written by Laxminath Bezbarua and music composed by Kamala Prasad Agarwala. The anthem was first published in 1909 in an Assamese magazine named 'Baahi'. It was officially adopted as Assam's state song in 1927 at Axom Chahitra Xonmilon held in Tezpur, Assam.

Fundamental Duties

Fundamental duties - It shall be the duty of every citizen of India -

- (a) to abide by the Constitution and respect its ideals and institutions, the National Flag and the National Anthem;
- (b) to cherish and follow the noble ideals which inspired our national struggle for freedom;
- (c) to uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India;
- (d) to defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so;
- (e) to promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities; to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women;
- (f) to value and preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture;
- (g) to protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers and wild life, and to have compassion for living creatures;
- (h) to develop the scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform;
- (i) to safeguard public property and to abjure violence;
- (j) to strive towards excellence in all spheres of individual and collective activity so that the nation constantly rises to higher levels of endeavour and achievement;
- (k) who is a parent or guardian to provide opportunities for education to his child or, as the case may be, ward between the age of six and fourteen years.

Meaning and Significance of the Indian National Flag

The national flag of India was adopted on 22nd July 1947 in the wake of Indian independence from British rule. The flag has three horizontal bands and is known as the tricolour. The topmost band is saffron in colour, the middle is white and the bottom most is green. There is a Navy blue wheel with 24 spokes in the middle of the white band.

The Tricolour and the Wheel of the Indian flag reveals the following:

1) **Saffron Colour**

The Saffron colour in the topmost band of the national flag indicates courage and selflessness. It is the common and religiously significant colour of religions like Hinduism, Buddhism and Jainism and it stands for renunciation and absolution of the ego of the people belonging to different religious background.

2) **White Colour**

The middle band of the Indian national flag is designed using the white colour which represents honesty, purity and peace of the nation. The white colour also represents cleanliness and knowledge.

3) **Green Colour**

The lowermost band of the Indian national flag is designed using the green colour which represents the faith, fertility and prosperity of the nation. The green colour is a festive and stabilizing colour which represents life and happiness.

4) **Ashok Chakra**

The centre of the Indian flag, contains the Ashok Chakra, which has 24 spokes and is blue in colour. It is a representation of constant movement and progress.

General Guidelines

1. Read the contents of this almanac carefully and abide by the rules laid down by the school authorities.
2. Whenever you write to the school about your ward, always quote his/her full name, class, section and admission number.
3. Sending gifts to the teachers is strictly prohibited.
4. No child will be allowed to leave the school premises before the school is over unless the Principal or any competent authority in his absence has granted permission. Parents are requested not to make any social engagements or medical appointments during working hours.
5. To get the best from the school for your child, you are advised to maintain close contact with the school. We earnestly recommend parents and guardians to look into their school almanac everyday and see that the lessons and homework assigned for the day are signed and done.
6. Parents are required to inform the school if there is any change in the address/telephone numbers.
7. The students should be encouraged to cultivate a habit of cleanliness and should be taught to maintain personal hygiene such as having clean ears, clipped nails and trimmed hair.
8. Should there be any infectious diseases in your house, please report the same to the school authorities. It is preferable not to send your ward to the school till the quarantine period is over.
9. As the medium of instruction in this school is English, students should be helped to follow their work easily and intelligently by a certain amount of regular reading and conversation in English at home.
10. Our school is a poly bag free zone. Parents are requested not to send or bring any items like lunch packs, stationery, craft articles etc. to school in poly bags.
11. It is appreciable to lodge a complaint related to bus at the school desk rather than at the stoppage. A written complaint to the Transport I/C or Discipline I/C will help us to sort out the problems effectively.
12. Any abusive language used by the student/parents/guardian for the transport staff shall be seriously dealt with.
13. Consult the school calendar, date sheets and other particulars and sign the almanac regularly.
14. Discourage private tuition.
15. Students travelling for the purpose of educational tours/excursions/workshops/sporting events/competitions held outside the school must necessarily have to bear all the expenses incurred as part of travel charges. However, registration, food and lodging of the students shall be taken care of by the school.
16. Parents/guardians are advised not to be involved in physical or mental abuse of any fellow classmate/friend of their ward for any reason whatsoever. In case of any problem, that may arise, complaints may be lodged with the competent authority to resolve the matter.
17. Parents are requested to check the school website for any updates.

Rules for Unfair Means Cases for School Based Examinations

To ensure that the examinations are conducted in a fair manner certain rules have been framed by the school. If a student is found indulging in any of the following, during the course of any internal examination of the school, he/she shall be deemed to have used unfair means and his/her answer sheet will be marked as UNFAIR MEANS (U.F.M):

- a) Having in possession papers, books, notes or any other material or information relevant to the examination in the paper concerned during the conduct of the examination
- b) giving or receiving assistance of any kind directly or indirectly or attempting to communicate with other students, teachers, invigilators during the examinations
- c) writing questions or answers on any material other than the answer script given by the school
- d) tearing of any page of the answer script, question paper or supplementary sheets. etc.
- e) contacting or communicating or trying to do so with any person (teaching or non-teaching) including peers or other students, during the examination time in the examination room or in washrooms and corridors
- f) exchanging question paper or answer scripts during the examination with any other student
- g) found reading/discussing answers with other students in the washroom/corridors during the examinations
- h) found in possession of any electronic gadgets, smart watches in the examination hall/room
- i) not submitting the answer script to the invigilator and taking it out of the examination hall/room after the paper is over
- j) taking the question paper and answer scripts or its part and also pens and other stationery out of the exam room during the exam time
- k) threatening/misbehaving with the invigilator, exam in charges or any other student or teachers
- l) found copying answers either from some other candidate or from any other source
- m) use of abusive language or making derogatory remarks in the answer book
- n) using or attempting to use any other undesirable method or means in connection with the examination

Imposition of Penalties

If a student is found guilty of any of the unfair means mentioned above, penalty will be imposed by the school authority, depending on the nature of the offence. Penalties will be as follows:

- a) ZERO MARKS will be awarded in a particular subject/paper if a student is found in possession of papers, books, notes or any other material or information relevant to the examination in that paper concerned during the conduct of examination.
- b) Marks for a particular subject/paper will be deducted for use of any other unfair means as per the home examination policy.
- c) May be disqualified from appearing in the rest of the examinations or that particular examination or in serious cases, he/she may be debarred from writing exams for that year
- d) In the report cards of all candidates who have been reported to have used unfair means in examinations, remarks will be mentioned as 'U.F.M'.
- e) All cases of Unfair Means shall be reported to the Unfair Means Committee and the result of such students shall be dealt with in the manner recommended by the Unfair Means Committee of the School.
- f) Before any penalty is imposed on a student reported to have used unfair means, he/she shall be given an opportunity to explain his/her conduct. He/she will be required to appear personally along with parents before the Unfair Means Committee to explain his/her conduct. In case he/she does not avail himself/herself of the opportunity by the given date, ex-parte decision taken by the Unfair Means Committee shall be final.
- g) If the school is satisfied that the use of unfair means in a paper or papers has been widespread in a room, the school has the right to cancel examination of that particular subject/paper concerned or even the entire examination, if several papers are involved.
- h) The names of students, who are penalised under any of the above rules, shall be communicated to all the teachers, various departments of the school dealing with academic and extracurricular activities. He/she will not be considered for any of school's academic award like "star of the month" etc.
- i) As soon as it comes or is brought to the notice of the exam in charges/invigilators/teachers that a student during the course of examination, has been found using or attempting to use unfair means, the answer script of the candidate along with the question paper(s) or other material(s), if any, found with him/her will be taken away and the invigilator will provide the candidate with a second answer book immediately.
- j) The invigilator will write the time when the Answer Script/Question Paper is taken away and new Answer Script is issued, and mark U.F.M on both old and new Answer Script and Question Paper, and put his/her signature. After the concerned examination is over, the student shall be asked by the invigilator/exam in charge/other in charges to submit his/ her explanation in regard to the allegation against him/her. If the student refuses to give an explanatory statement, the fact of refusal should also be recorded.

Identity Card

1. Every student must wear his/her RFID card.
2. If mutilated or lost, a new identity card will have to be purchased by the parents by giving an application on the prescribed form available at the administrative office along with the replacement charge of Rs 450. They must also ensure that the mutilated cards are immediately surrendered along with the application form.

School Rules

1. Students should affix their photographs and write their required information duly signed by their parents in the space provided in the almanac.
2. Every student should carry his/her almanac to school everyday.
3. No slogan writing or scribbling is permitted on the school uniform worn during the school hours in the school premises.
4. Students are expected to respect all school property. No student should damage any school furniture, write or draw anything on the walls or in any way, damage things belonging to others. Damage done by accident should be reported at once to the class teacher or to the Principal. Any damage done will be made good by the one who causes it.
5. No shouting or whistling is allowed in the school premises.
6. Change of classrooms between periods should be done in silence and in an orderly manner.
7. The school is not responsible for the goods lost. It is advisable not to bring valuables to the school.
8. Students are not allowed to carry mobile phones or any other electronic gadgets to the school campus.
9. No books, magazines, photographs, CDs, DVDs, pendrives etc. other than the reading books or library books should be brought to the school. The school reserves the right to check the school bags and uniforms of the students and seize any undesirable materials found in their bags/possession.
10. Students who commute under the care of escorts should never leave the school before the escort arrives. In case of delay, they should inform the school office.
11. The school reserves the right to suspend or take strict disciplinary action against a student whose diligence or progress in studies is constantly unsatisfactory or whose conduct towards the school community is undesirable.

12. No student shall indulge in any of the following practices namely:
 - Spitting in or near the school premises
 - Rowdy and rude behavior
 - Resorting to violence in any form
 - Bursting crackers, throwing colours or painting faces within or near the school premises or in the school bus.
 - Bunking classes
13. Students should always remember that the school is judged by their conduct. They should greet elders of the school whenever and wherever they meet them. Students are expected to wish and be courteous to all the visitors in the school. Bullying and usage of foul language are punishable offences.
14. All students are expected to label their shoes, bags, blazers to avoid confusion.
15. Arms are not allowed in the campus, except the school's security establishments'. Parents/Guardians/Visitors will be frisked for the safety and security of the students and are therefore, requested not to bring arms or armed guards inside the campus.
16. It is mandatory for the students who come to school by private vehicle to wear the seat belt and the helmet in case they come by two wheelers.

For the security of your ward inside the school campus the following points merit your kind attention:

1. Parents are advised to adhere to the discipline norms of the school and be seated at the Front Office only. Movement in the academic block without written permission from the Front Desk is prohibited.
2. The school canteen is exclusively for the students and the staff. However parents can use it only during the PTM.

Entry to and Dispersal from the school

1. Parents are prohibited from bringing their personal vehicles inside the school campus any time during the day except on the special occasions like School Carnival, PTM, Annual Function etc.
2. Parents/guardians/drivers who come to drop the children must do so at the main gate. It is suggested that the students must carry an umbrella or wear a rain coat depending on the weather conditions.

3. Students shall not be permitted to enter the main gate of the school after 7:50 am (MW & SW) / 9:15 am (JW) and without wearing their Identity Cards. Thereafter, no request shall be entertained by the authorities. In such cases, the guardians are requested to take their wards back.
4. The parents using their personal conveyance for commuting their wards are requested to wait with the 2nd Identity Card of the child provided to them at the main gate to collect their wards. Without the Identity Card the parents shall have to undergo a long office procedure which may take an hour.
5. Students who do not pay the bus fee and use their personal conveyance for commuting must/will:
 - a. be dropped at the main gate of the school before 7:45 am (MW & SW) / 7:45 am (JW-March to October) & 9:25 am (JW-November to February) in the morning.
 - b. wear their Identity Card and show the same to the teacher on duty at the main gate.
 - c. not be attending the dispersal assembly for National Anthem but shall line up at Anand Sarowar Park near the security post.
 - d. not be allowed to go with their friends.
 - e. not be handed over to any person not carrying the 2nd I- Card. Hence, it is the responsibility of the parents to maintain the safety of the Identity Cards of their wards.
6. Students who pay the bus fee but many a times the parents drop/pick them to and from the school must/will:
 - a. do so at the main gate only after making an entry in the register/format available with the teacher standing at the main gate
 - b. be dropped at the main gate of the school before 7:45 am in the morning.
 - c. wear their Identity Card and show the same to the teacher on duty at the main gate.
 - d. not be handed over to any person not carrying the 2nd I - Card. Hence, it is the responsibility of the parents to maintain the safety of the Identity Cards of their wards.

School Inclusion Policy for Children with Special Needs (CWSN)

- DPSG has a Counseling and Special Education Unit responsible for ensuring the inclusion of students with diverse disabilities.
- A School Inclusion committee is in place to support and safeguard the students with special needs.
- Admission of candidates having special needs will depend upon the availability of seats which will be reflected in the DPSG website in the online registration tab.
- Students if identified having a disability by the teachers will be referred to the Special Education Unit for further intervention as per the school policy.
- Parents/ guardians of students who find their ward struggling with academics and/or suspect a disability, can also directly meet the Special educator/counsellors to seek for any assistance concerning their ward.
- If a student is identified as having a disability that was not previously identified, then as per school policy the parents will be directed to the certified agencies/ clinical psychologists for a diagnosis.
- Parents who do not wish to procure their wards' psycho-diagnostic report, are to provide an undertaking stating the same.
- In case a student faces considerable difficulties in academics and is not diagnosed, he/she will be taken care of by the special education department till grade 3. Beyond grade 3, a student has to be diagnosed with a disability to qualify for Sp. Ed. Remedial Intervention.
- The students with a diagnosis certification by a clinical psychologist of a disability in condition will be eligible for Special Education and counselling intervention as laid out in the school policy for Children with special needs (CWSN).
- The written consent of the parents is necessary to proceed with the special education intervention in school. Availing Special education intervention is not mandatory. Parents have the option to choose or not to choose for the intervention. However, proper intervention is recommended for better inclusion and support of the child in school.
- From class VI onwards, certified students under CWSN category can avail all the provisions and concessions as per CBSE circular No. CBSE/COORD/112233/2019 dated 12th April 2019. The following are the provisions:

“That which can be asserted without evidence, can be dismissed without evidence.”

- Under CWSN category, students are eligible to avail Language subject exemption (third language or Hindi) as per CBSE guidelines from grade VI to VIII.
- **Flexibility in choosing subjects:** From class IX onwards, students with disabilities as defined in The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act 2016 have the option of studying one compulsory language as against two.
- Besides one language, CWSN students have the flexibility in choosing Optional Subjects as per CBSE guidelines stated in the circular vide No. CBSE/COORD/112233/2019.
- The optional subjects given by our school for classes IX and X currently are Home Science (064), Computer Application (165), Hindustani Music Vocal (034), Hindustani Music Percussion (036), Painting (049) and Marketing and Sales (412)
- For Class XI and XII, current subject options are only limited to Fine Arts / Painting (049), Physical Education (048), Marketing and Sales (412)
- For a subject change in class 9 or 10, parents are to fill in an application format given by the school.
- Various Examination Provisions are also in effect for the students under CWSN category namely:
 - Facility of a prompter and reader during main examination
 - Modified paper for the diagnosed and certified students.
 - **Compensatory time:** Compensatory time if required is to be provided to the CWSN students as per CBSE guidelines.

Student's Early Departure (ED)

The school is very stringent with regard to late arrival or early departure of students. ED will not be permitted to any student unless there is a medical contingency in the school premises. Kindly refrain from sending your ward to the school in case of any medical issue or family engagement. Moreover, the student will not be eligible for 100 % attendance in case of late arrival or early departure.

Absence

1. It is compulsory for all students to have minimum 75% attendance.
2. To apply for leave, the parent must fill up the Student Leave Application Performa from the leave booklet issued, along with a signed note in the almanac on the "Record of Absence" page.
3. To avail Medical Leave (ML), the Student Leave Application Performa must be submitted along with relevant medical documents including a Medical Certificate issued by a registered medical practitioner.
4. Students suffering from any infectious or contagious disease must produce a medical certificate issued by a registered medical practitioner, permitting him/her to rejoin school or resume duties.
5. Students suffering from the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before rejoining school:

a.	Chicken Pox	Till complete falling of scabs
b.	Cholera	Till the child is completely recovered
c.	Measles	Two weeks after the rash disappears
d.	Mumps	Till the swelling has completely gone
e.	Whooping Cough	6 weeks
f.	Jaundice	6 weeks
g.	Corona Virus	15 days

6. During PTM days, attendance will be given to the students only if parent/s have attended the PTM on the given day (day scholars).
7. A student can avail Duty Leave (DL) only for representing the school at the international/ national /state level in any cultural, literary or sporting event.
8. Any student availing Early Departure (ED), or with one or more instance of Late Arrival (LA) is not entitled for 100% class/ school attendance.
9. Any student found missing classes during regular school hours once or more than once, without the concerned teacher's prior permission, will also not be qualified for 100% attendance.
10. It is compulsory for all students to be present on the first working day after each vacation.
11. Repeated or Unexplained absence for more than 6 consecutive working days or more than 3 days immediately after vacation renders the student liable to have his/her name struck off from the rolls, without any notice. Re-admission may be granted only on fresh payment of the admission fee.

2. **Identity card with photograph of the student must be worn on every working day and for all school functions.**
3. Students of classes III and above are to wear their house T-shirts and sports shoes during sporting events and games periods.
4. Students necessarily have to wear specified black shoes properly cleaned and polished.
5. Any sporting gear like trackpant, house T-shirt, trackjacket etc. is to be worn only on the days when students have sports classes.
6. It is mandatory for girls to wear track pants whenever and wherever they participate in any sporting activity. However the HOD Sports or coaches can decide on the outfit to be worn in the playing arena as per the rules and regulations of the sporting discipline.

- ❖ Late Fine @ ₹ 10.00 per day from 11th day of the First month of the Relevant Quarter till the last day of the 1st month and thereafter @ ₹ 50.00 per day from 1st day of the 2nd month of the Relevant Quarter till the date of payment (including holidays) is leviable for failing to pay the Fees by the due date on 10th of the 1st month of relevant Quarter.
- ❖ If Fee is paid after the due date, **it must be paid along with applicable late fine.**
- ❖ Apart from Enrolment Fee, Development Fee, Activity Fee and RFID Fee (as applicable), Tuition Fee, Bus Fee and Boarding Fee (as applicable) must be paid in full for entire Academic Year, i.e., from April to March. Bus fee for the whole quarter in which bus service have been withdrawn, has to be paid in full.** No reduction/concession/ exemption on Bus Fee will be granted on grounds of closure of the school due to Holidays, Vacations, Leaves (including study leaves), Session Breaks, and Bandhs etc.
- ❖ Before applying for Transfer Certificate / withdrawal of the student from the School/Hostel, three months advance notice is to be given to the school or in lieu 3 months Fee is to be paid to the school.
- ❖ If a student is withdrawn from the school; Fees for the entire Quarter in which the student has been withdrawn has to be paid.
- ❖ **In the event of non-payment of School Fees within 3 months from the pay by date applicable for the relevant Quarter, the student may be debarred from attending his/ her classes.**

*** During ongoing remedial classes, the allotted community service will be substituted with the remedial classes looking into the academic interest of the student.*

ICT and Cyber Security

Internet is available for students for educational purposes. However strict disciplinary action as deemed fit will be taken against those who do not take the following points into consideration while accessing the internet and social networking sites

- Respect other users' personal data (for example photos), and not to post these data without the users' consent.
- Keep passwords undisclosed, even from best friends, and choose difficult passwords to that purpose
- Not to harass/bully others on the internet.
- Avoid strangers online, and report harmful or any sort of suspicious behaviour encountered online.
- Respect other people's intellectual property on the internet.
- Be able to have freedom of expression on the internet, but at the same time respect other people's identities and values.
- Help friends and younger children navigate safely on the internet.
- Protect image and self esteem in the digital world, as in the real world.
- Always cross check the validity of online information.
- Navigate only to websites appropriate for one's age, respect age restrictions and read 'Policies' and 'Terms' of the websites used.
- Downloading undesirable materials.
- Pen drives, Hard drives and CD's should not be brought to school without the written permission of the teacher or concerned authority.

Swimming Rules

Swimming is compulsory in DPS Guwahati. It is mandatory for students to reach the swimming pool and report to their coach/instructor in case of his/her presence in the school, failing which the student will be liable for necessary action to be taken by the competent authority. Those who are medically unfit, need to produce a medical certificate for not swimming. Students suffering from any water borne diseases are strictly prohibited from entering the pool. DPS Guwahati Swimming pool is a private pool, and only students of the school and authorized members of the school may use its facilities.

- The students are strictly forbidden from going near/into the pool unless the trainer accompanies them.
- The swimming pool facilities can only be availed as per the given timing.
- All swimmers must swim in proper costume and bring with them towels, soaps, caps etc.
- Students should not leave the swimming pool till the lessons/practices are over. Permission to leave the pool can be granted by the swimming coach/lifeguard in exceptional case.
- The safety precaution, as enforced by the lifeguard/coach, must be observed.
- The school reserves the right to restrict entry on account of misconduct, misbehaviour or improper swimming attire.
- Changes made in the regulations shall be informed to all the students and will be binding under all circumstances.
- Splash & Shallow pools are for beginners only.
- School will not be responsible for any valuables lost in the pool premises.
- Though the school takes utmost care, yet the school shall not be held responsible for any mishap in or around the swimming pool area.

Library Rules

1. Students are allowed to enter the library only with their identity cards.
2. Students are allowed to borrow books with their own identity cards only.
3. Reference books are not for issue. These books can be consulted within the library premises only. Books other than reference books are issued for one week.
4. Books marked, disfigured or damaged will have to be replaced by the same/recent edition or paid for by the borrower after paying one and a half times the cost of the book.
5. Students/Teachers are not allowed to bring their personal books or belongings inside the library.
6. Book misplaced is book lost.
7. On 4th Saturdays the library shall remain closed for the staff and the students.
8. Laptops shall be permitted to be carried to the library. A4 sheets/Pencil shall be provided for any written work.
9. Checking of the examination answer scripts in the library is strictly prohibited.
10. Entrance to the book processing area is restricted.
11. Maintain silence in the library.
12. Late fine for not returning the books on time shall be imposed as given below. The late fine shall not be charged if a student remains absent with authorised leave.
₹ 20/- for 1 to 3 working days. ₹ 50/- for 4 to 7 working days.
13. Footwear (shoes, slipper, sandals etc.) is strictly prohibited inside the library. The same should be kept at the designated place, outside the library.

Extra classes for special students

Special classes are held after school for students from classes III to XII if they are observed to require special attention. School transport will be available which will ply on predetermined routes or the routes as informed to the students in advance. Students of Class IX & X will be given tutorials as and when required to prepare them for all types of questions in the end term exam.

School Transport

Students can avail the school transport subject to the availability of seats and the feasibility of plying of the bus on the desired route. The routes of the school buses are drawn up well in advance and the parents should consult the school transport In-charge for necessary details. It will be the responsibility of the guardian to escort the child to and from the respective bus stops.

Bus Rules

1. All students using the school bus are expected to be at the bus stop at least 5 minutes before the arrival time of the bus. Also note that the buses will not wait for the late comers.
2. The bus stoppages are prepared keeping in view the safety of all bus commuters; hence do not ask the drivers to make any changes in the same.
3. Students will be held responsible for any damage to buses caused by negligence or vandalism.
4. The driver's attention must not be distracted while driving.
5. Students are not allowed to eat while commuting in the school bus. Bus conductors have all the right to stop the students from doing so.
6. Transport related complaints must be lodged in writing with the Transport Manager.
7. To avoid any kind of confusion students necessarily have to board the buses as soon as the school gets over. It would be the responsibility of the parents to pick up their children from the campus if they do not board the buses on time.
8. Parents changing residence away from the predetermined route shall inform the school authority well in advance. Any realignment of route shall be made only when it is not inconvenient to plying of the bus. Otherwise parents shall have to avail the nearest bus stop.
9. If a student does not take the designated route due to any reason, his/her parents have to give a written note to the transport manager through the class teacher on or before that particular day.
10. If there is any mechanical breakdown of transport service, another bus will be provided but the driver and helper will remain unchanged.
11. In case of any eventualities, parents are requested not to take the matter into their own hands. For any serious lapses, parents may lodge a written complaint with the school authority.
12. The school authority shall not be responsible for late arrival of bus at the stoppages due to sudden traffic jam/sudden breakdown of the bus. However, students so held up will be allowed to join their class and full attendance will be given for the lost period.
13. In the event of sudden declaration of holiday/bandh, parents are requested to contact the Transport Manager over phone or call on the mobile number of the respective bus drivers only.
14. It will be the responsibility of the parents/guardians to drop/pick up their child/ward to and from the school on sudden stoppage of work affecting the bus service. If the situation continues beyond a period of more than a week, the corresponding amount of bus fees shall be adjusted in the next installment of bus fees only.
15. Students not wearing RFID cards will not be allowed to board the school bus.

Awards

- 100 % Attendance - A student will be awarded Certificate of Cent Percent Attendance at the end of the academic session.
- One student amongst all the sections of a class from class VI onwards will be given a Scholar's certificate.
- Abhilasha Memorial Scholarship will be awarded to the Class VII topper of the session.
- FIRST THREE school toppers in the board exam (irrespective of the stream) shall be given an award for academic excellence.
- Students qualifying for any zonal /national/international sporting event will be felicitated during the Annual Prize Distribution Ceremony conducted every year in the school premises.

Recognition for Outstanding Performance in Sports

- * Dipsites who are promising sportspersons and are representing at the International/National/Zonal/State/District level "prestigious" tournament shall be granted duty leave (DL) during exams or otherwise. It is the collective decision of the recommending committee to decide the tournament as "prestigious" and the sole jurisdiction of the Principal to approve.
- * While participating in the aforesaid events if a child misses out on any examination, the average will be computed while declaring the result.
- * In case the child is within the top 10 position in academics amongst all the sections of the class, he or she will be eligible for class rank.
- * The DL in such cases will be treated as part of the presence in the attendance for the month.
- Sports Scholarship will be awarded as per the school guidelines to the students who qualify any zonal/national/international sporting event.

Detention

On non compliance of meeting the deadline of homework, students of Classes III to V will be detained during the break time and/or extra curricular activity periods. Students of classes VI to XII will be detained after the school hours to complete their Home/Class Assignment or for any act of indiscipline.

Withdrawal

One clear calendar month's notice in writing or a month's fee in lieu of notice must be given before the pupil is withdrawn. Transfer certificate will not be issued until all dues of the school are cleared. Students can be asked to leave the school on the following grounds-

- (i) Indiscipline (ii) Unsatisfactory progress in work (iii) Detention in a class for the second year

Lost and Found

Any lost belongings of the student found in the school premises or in the bus would be kept in room no.3- ground floor, activity block. Students are required to identify and collect their articles from the same after they enter their name in the register maintained by the In-charge.
